COOKE FOOD STORE

Thank you for all your contributions to Foodstore and also the generous financial donations that enable us to supply fresh basic goods in our food packs such as bread, milk, eggs, cheese and fruit.

Our client list continues to grow with new referrals on a regular basis. We are so blessed to be in a position to help both local people in need at this time, as well as those in the wider area.

In January we distributed around 25 food packs but the impact of the cost of living crisis saw this rise to 46 food packs in May.

Demand had been rising each month and on average we are now providing food for around 30- 40 people each week - some families and a number of single adults. The gratitude of those receiving help in this way is often very moving, with one lady describing Foodstore as 'a lifeline'.

Our working relationships with our partner churches in Ballynafeigh and, with other charities continue to grow and ensure we provide what is needed and minimise waste. It is hoped to develop our outreach further in the summer months to provide snacks for children living in temporary accommodation. These children are provided with basic meals but have little or no access to snacks. Hopefully this will be established before the new school term begins so that fewer children go to school without something for breaktime.

We are so grateful for all your support in this work.

...on a month with Rev Dave Gray

What an amazing month it has been since Dave Gray was installed as our new Minister!

Invitations to Dave and Jane's friends, and special guests, were sent out electronically and as the responses were received, we knew it was going to be a big event and it was!

The church was filled, the singing was powerful, the Charge to the Minister and the Congregation from Rev Ivan Steen was both passionate and personal but, despite everyone being in suits, ties and formal attire, it was also a relaxed and joyful evening when everything went smoothly, guests felt welcomed and the effort made by so many to set up the McWilliams Hall and provide and serve our many visitors was greatly appreciated. Huge thanks to Pamela McWilliams and the whole team for the planning and preparation that went into that evening.

Even before the Installation on Sunday 15th May Dave was planning and thinking ahead and so, despite struggling with a chest infection and on antibiotics, he really "hit the ground running" as he started to get to know people through phone calls and visits, providing pastoral support and encouragement, as well as starting the preparations for our summer Mission "Rocky Railway" and arranging a regular time of Ministry to residents in Arlington Nursing Home.

He updated the furniture in the Ministers Room to create a welcoming space for people to meet with a little privacy and has already used that space to host an early morning Bible Class (with pancakes).

He has chaired meetings of the Kirk Session and Congregational Committee, starting both with Pizza and a time to chat and get to know everyone; he has supported family members following 2 bereavements and shared in 2 funeral services with Dr Jim Campbell and has hosted an end of year party for our young people.

Morning worship on 22nd May started us thinking about new beginnings as we have followed a new series called "Distinctives" asking how we live in our time and place to capture hearts and reveal Jesus. We have watched short video clips telling Bible stories as well as clips from "High School Musical" and "The Lion, the witch and the wardrobe", we have joined in the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations with strawberries and cream, shared in a 60th wedding anniversary blessing with confetti canons, watched as Dave and some of our young people erected a tent as a reminder of Abraham's journey in Genesis, celebrated a Cradle Roll and Children's Day service with ice cream from an ice cream van and shared in a family Communion service with pancakes and juice for the younger children and the smell of freshly baked bread from Dave's breadmaker filling the Sanctuary.

His ministry in our first month has been one of encouragement and hospitality. His warm sense of humour, his obvious love and gift of teaching and his joy when sharing scripture and talking of God's love, power, authority, grace and mercy has been inspiring for all of us.

It has been wonderful to have Dave's wife Jane singing with the Praise Group, (she sings beautiful harmonies), his daughter Amelie and her friend Kate taking part in services and playing with our

Little Cookes, and Elliot and Amelie being part of our Genesis youth. We have also been so encouraged by the visitors who have been joining us each week, it is lovely to see these new faces.

A fellow Cooke member shared with me that they left Sunday morning worship feeling uplifted and energised for the week ahead. God's power is truly at work.
